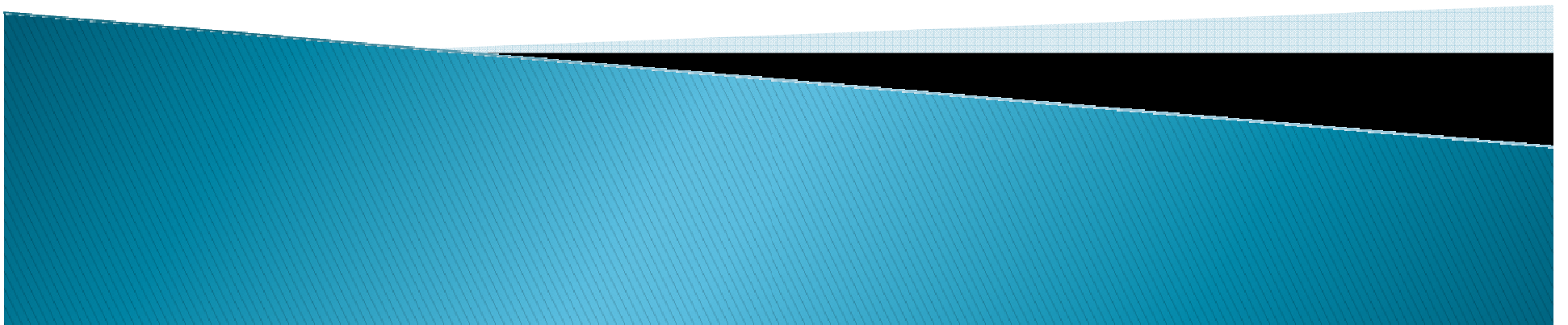

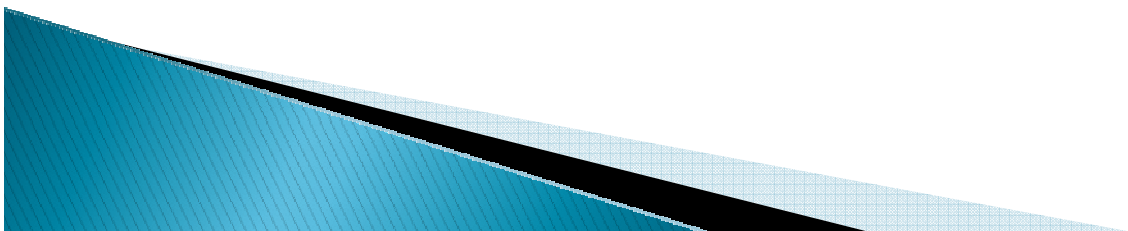

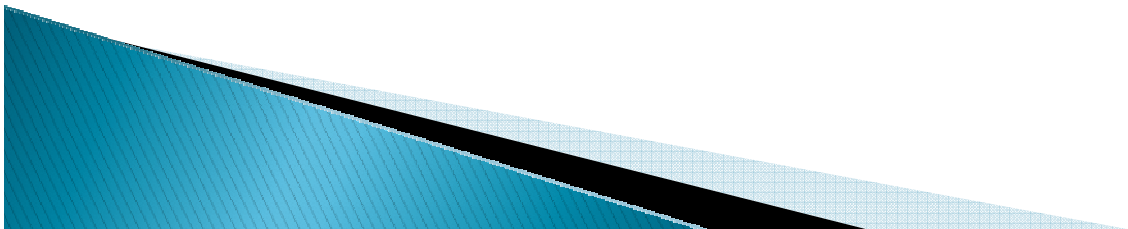
KEY AREAS OF INTEREST

▶ PEOPLE PARTICIPATION

- Democratic governance not only related to pillar #6 but also Pillar #1
- Platform where citizens can contribute to policy, strategy, programmes and projects, for eg. Have an electronic repository for suggestions and feedback
- Forum for citizens to make contribution to issues in parliament

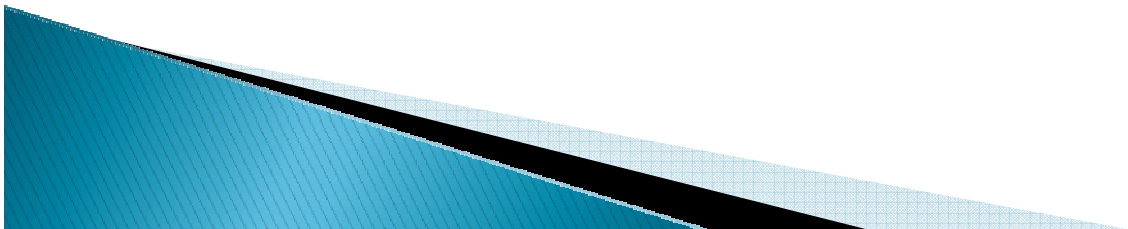


- ▶ Inclusion of issues in education system(primary to tertiary) to strengthen knowledge in democratic governance
- ▶ Education in the area of Local Governance, generally and more specifically for women and youths
- ▶ Education in the area Civic engagement at the level of the schools, Civil Society Organisations and Universities to create future leaders

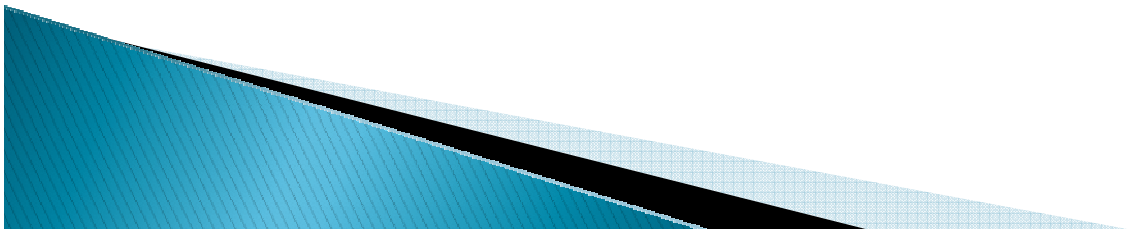


▶ Anti-corruption

- Short term interventions to promote transparency, accountability and value for money
- Long term interventions through education to reduce the perceived and/or actual high level of tolerance of corruption



- ▶ **Mentoring programme**
 - Develop framework for recognizing successful persons and use these persons as mentors in a sustainable way
- ▶ **CSR**
 - Education of employees on the reasons for CSR engagement to obtain greater support
- ▶ **Create a CSR database**



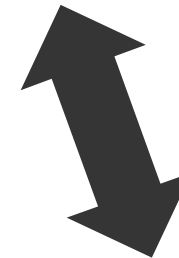

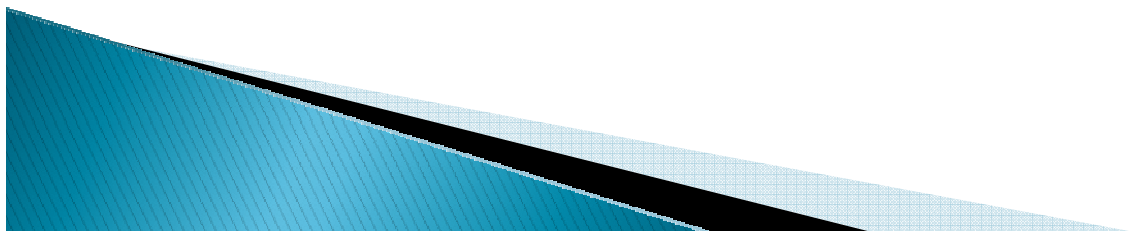
